

Alder Lake Park

Ring around the campfire

With its expansive campgrounds and great location, Alder Lake Park makes it easy to answer the call of the wild. Campers can choose between sites in the three campgrounds at Alder Lake Park or they can drive a few miles down the road and stay at the more solitary Rocky Point.

The 161-acre Alder Lake Park offers options for everyone from traditional tent campers to those who want more of the comforts of home like water, electric and sewer hookups.

Rocky Point campground, which is about 4 miles east of the main park entrance on Highway 7, has 25 sites with water and electric hookups.

Bring your buddies

Round up your friends and family and reserve sites in Alder Lake Park's group camp area. All 20 sites have water, electric and sewer hookups. You must reserve at least five sites, so plan ahead for your family reunion, team gathering or any other occasion that brings people together. The group camp has a kitchen shelter with barbecue grills, sinks and electrical outlets, a restroom with showers and areas for outdoor fun.

Unreserved spots in the group camp area may be available to other campers. If you'd like a larger area for your group, you must reserve and pay for the additional sites.

Whatever floats your boat

Boaters will find two boat launches at Alder Lake Park. The main boat launch, located near the entrance to the park, is usable most of the year. The Rocky Point boat launch, located at the upper end of the lake, is usable when the reservoir is at higher elevations.

Boaters who are camping at the park and want to moor their boats overnight can use the first-come, first-served 20-slip boat moorage dock at the Stacel Point day-use area. The park does not allow overnight camping on moored boats.

Go ahead, make your day

Two day-use areas in the Alder Lake recreation area offer unlimited options for fun. You'll find a swimming beach, playground, open lawn areas, picnic shelter, 45 picnic sites with tables and grills and a bathhouse with showers at Stacel Point. Please note that alcoholic beverages are prohibited at Stacel Point.

Sunny Beach Point, which is about a half mile south on State Route 7, is a nine-acre day-use park with a swimming beach, sunning area, picnic shelter, 20 picnic sites with tables and grills, restrooms and parking. The park opens May 15 and closes September 15, lake level permitting. Please note that alcoholic beverages are prohibited at Sunny Beach Point.

Best dam view around

When visiting Alder Lake Park, you must check out the impressive Alder Dam. The 330-foot structure, built in 1945, forms the seven-mile Alder Lake. View the dam from a marked turnoff point on Highway 7 or from Alder Lake Park.

ADA accessibility

We want everyone to enjoy our parks, so we continue to improve access for the mobility impaired. You'll find ADA-accessible campsites and wheelchair-accessible restrooms at Alder Lake Park. If you have other special needs, please contact the park in advance of your arrival to find out if we can accommodate your request.

About... Alder Lake Park

- Year-round camping (Park is closed December 20 through January 1)
- 173 individual campsites at four campgrounds: Main, Osprey, Elk Plain and Rocky Point
 - 35 with water, electric and sewer hookups
 - 74 with water and electric hookups
 - 62 tent sites
- 20-site group camp area with water, electric and sewer hookups
- Two day-use areas
 - Stacel Point open year round except December 20 through January 1
 - Sunny Beach Point open from May 15 to September 15, lake level permitting
- Two boat launches open year round, lake level permitting
- Fire rings or barbecue grills and picnic tables in all campsites
- Coin-operated showers
- Wheelchair-accessible sites and restrooms
- Water faucets throughout campgrounds

Camping fees

- \$28 Water/electric/sewer hookups
- \$27 Water/electric hookups
- \$21 Tent sites
- \$10 Extra vehicle (No charge for towed vehicles)

The group camp area has a five-site reservation minimum.
