

Mossyrock Park

Fun for one...

Planning to camp on your own or in a small group? Reserve individual campsites in one of three areas at Mossyrock Park: Main Campground, Cascade Loop or Bird's Eye View. Choose a site with electric and water hookups, or aim for adventure and reserve one of the 12 walk-in tent sites. Want to be a little more spontaneous? Camp in the first-come, first-served S'mores Loop.

...and fun for all

If you've got a gaggle of friends and family who need at least five campsites, check out Mossyrock's two group camp areas. The main group camp area is divided into three circles, all of which include community water stations, fire rings and picnic tables. The area also has a kitchen shelter with a fireplace/barbecue, sinks and electrical outlets, as well as horseshoe pits, a volleyball area and a restroom with showers.

Group campers who seek a more rustic environment might enjoy the primitive group camp area. Ten unimproved sites with picnic tables, fire rings, water and a vault toilet offer a back-to-the-basics experience for campers. You must reserve all ten sites if you want to camp in the primitive group camp area.

A day at a time

Enjoy beautiful views of Riffe Lake while picnicking at Mossyrock Park's day-use area. For those who want to do more than view, the lake is a great place for taking a dip at the swimming beach, boating and playing at the playground.

Fishing for fun?

If you're an avid angler, you'll enjoy dropping a line in Riffe Lake. It is loaded with cutthroat, rainbow and brown trout, as well as coho salmon, steelhead and bass. Swofford Pond, which is about three miles away from the park, is stocked with rainbow and brown trout and channel catfish. You'll also find large mouth bass and bluegill in the pond.

Take a hike

You and your family can get a little closer to nature by hiking on the two trails that begin near the primitive group camp area. In the summer, be on the lookout for birds, squirrels, chipmunks and raccoons. Winter campers may get an eyeful of elk. Herds of up to 80 animals have been known to wander through the park between the months of November and March.

Dam tall

Just a short drive away, you'll find an engineering marvel, Mossyrock Dam. It is the tallest dam in Washington state, standing 606 feet above bedrock. Not only does it look impressive, it also generates about one billion kilowatt-hours of electricity each year, enough to power about 78,000 Northwest homes.

ADA accessibility

We want everyone to enjoy our parks, so we continue to improve access for the mobility impaired. You'll find ADA-accessible campsites and wheelchair-accessible restrooms at Mossyrock Park.

Directions

From Tacoma, take I-5 south to Highway 12 East (Exit 68). Drive approximately 21 miles and turn right on Williams Street. Continue several blocks to a "T" intersection in the town of Mossyrock. Turn left onto State Street. State Street becomes Mossyrock Road East, and then Ajlune Road, which leads to the park.

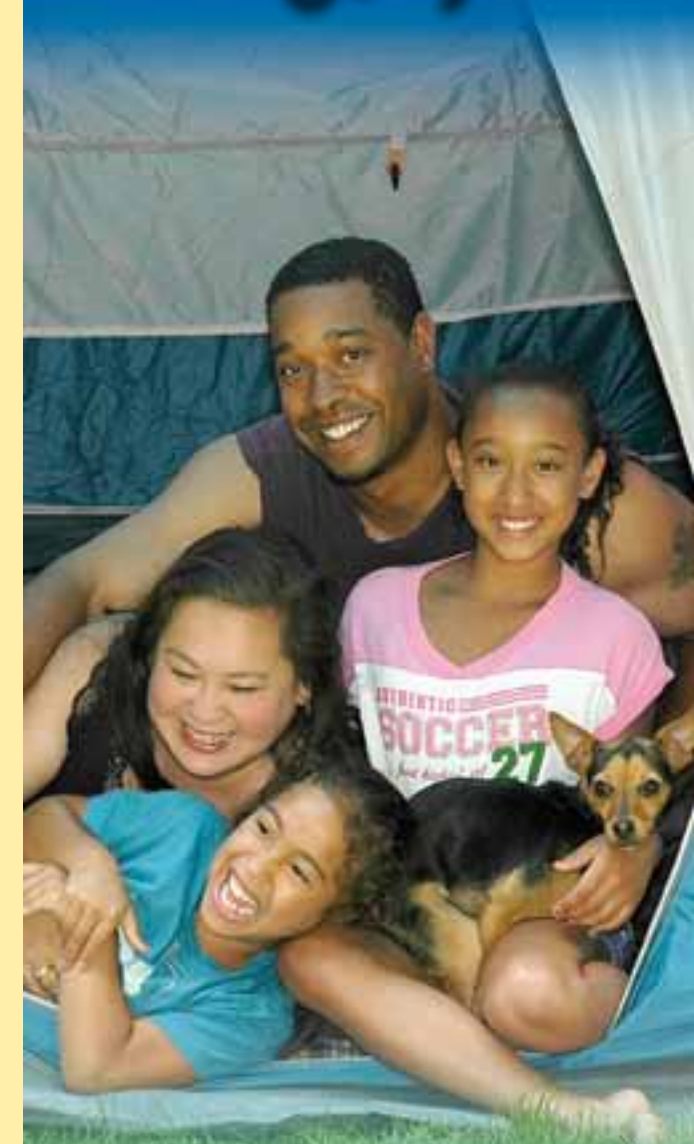

About... Mossyrock Park

- Year-round camping, day-use area and boat launch (Park is closed December 20 through January 1)
- 152 individual campsites (76 with water and electric hookups)
- Two group camp areas
 - 60-site group camp (25 with electric hookups)
 - 10-site primitive group camp (No hookups)
- Fire rings and picnic tables in all campsites
- Coin-operated showers
- Laundry facilities
- Store and fast-food concession stand (Seasonally operated)
- Wheelchair-accessible sites and restrooms
- Water faucets throughout campground
- Reservable kitchen shelter

Camping fees

- \$27 Water/electric hookups
- \$25 Electric hookup
- \$21 No hookups
- \$15 Walk-in tent and S'mores Loop sites
- \$150 Primitive group camp (You must reserve all 10 sites)
- \$10 Extra vehicle/RV, if space allows (No charge for towed vehicles)
- \$75 Extra vehicle season pass
- \$10 Unattended vehicle

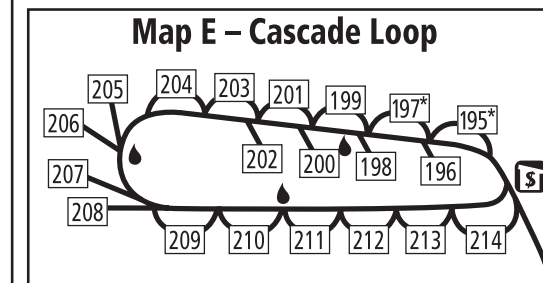
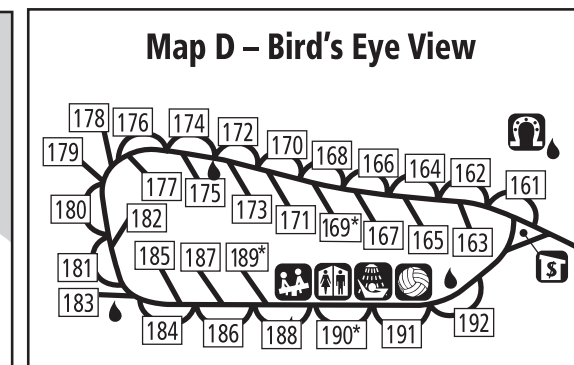
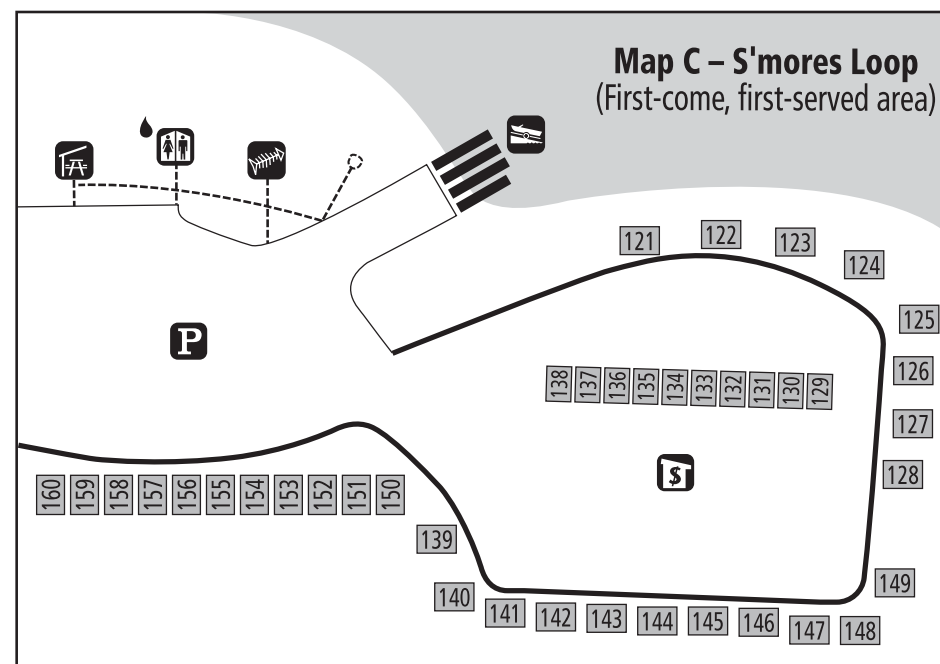
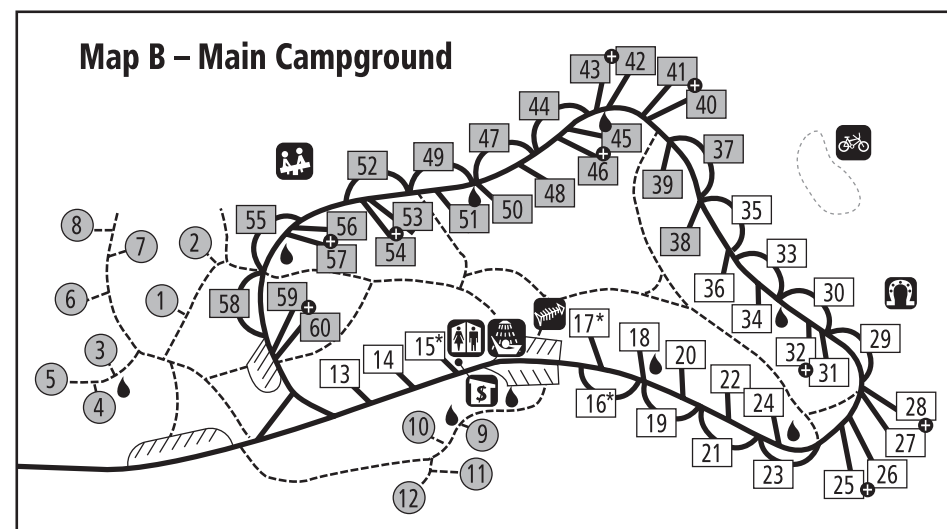
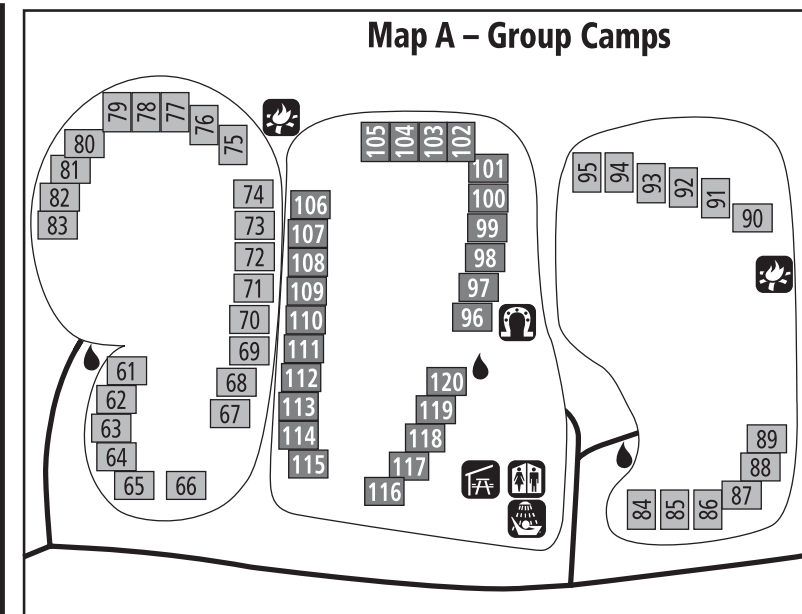
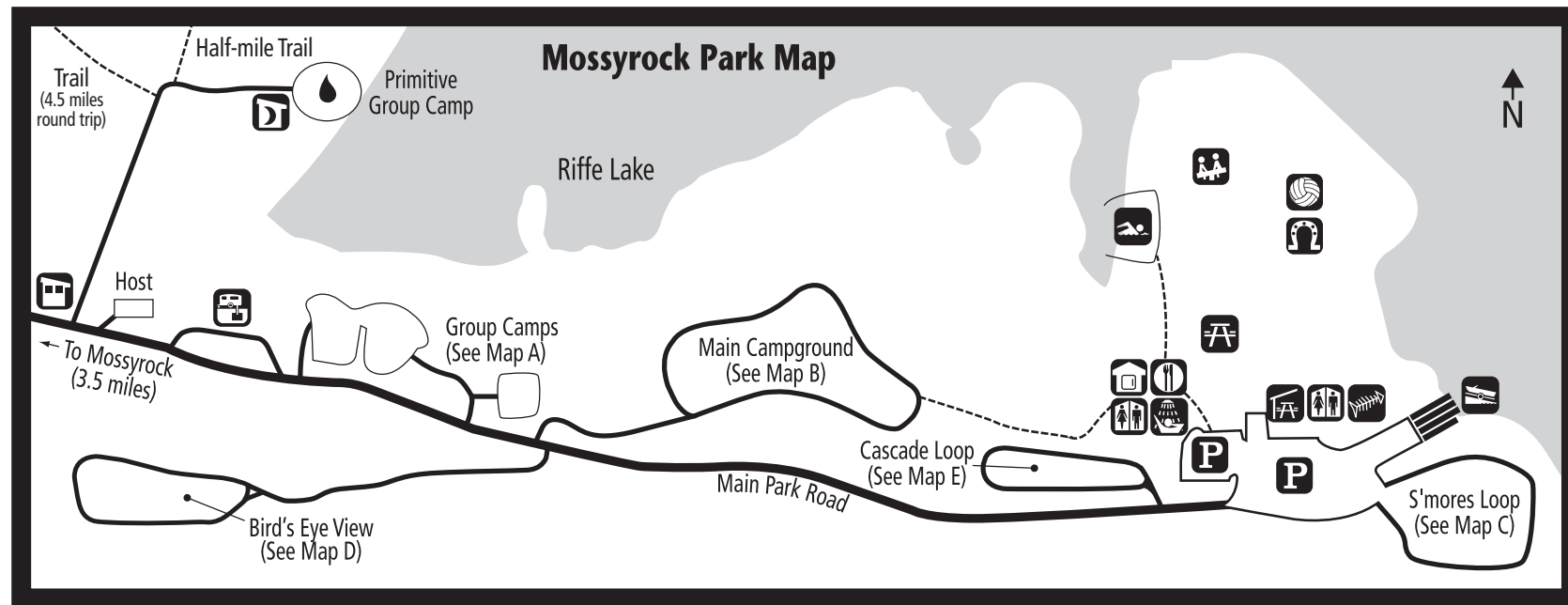
The main group camp area has a five-site reservation minimum.
