Overview

The Public Utility Board, in coordination with the Tacoma City Council, is in the process of hiring a new TPU director.

To inform the process, the Public Utility Board wants feedback from the public and employees.

Overview

Feedback from customers and employees will be collected online between December 15 and January 15. Three questions will be asked:

- What do you like about TPU?
- What do you not like about TPU?
- What questions would you like the Utility Board and City Council to ask the applicants for Utility Director?

The Board will host a public hearing at its Jan. 10 meeting to give people a chance to share their thoughts in person.

Public Affairs Assignment

Assist the Board and Mycoff and Associates by:

- Creating an online tool for the public and TPU employees to answer the three questions
- Collecting the feedback so it can be passed along in an aggregated format
- Promoting the tool and the January 10 public hearing to a broad range of audiences

Feedback Collection

Web pages on MyTPU.org will include a form for customers and employees to answer the three questions.

TPU staff will collect the feedback from customers and employees, and will provide the information to Mycoff for validation on or about Jan. 19.

- High-level summary of themes for each of the three questions
- Raw data that includes all responses to the three questions


