

RESOLUTION NO. U-11201

A RESOLUTION related to the purchase of materials, supplies, equipment and the furnishing of services; authorizing the City officials to enter into contracts and, where specified, waive competitive bidding requirements, authorize sale of surplus property, or increase or extend existing agreements.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, requested bids/proposals for the purchase of certain materials, supplies, equipment and/or the furnishing of certain services, or proposes to purchase off an agreement previously competitively bid and entered into by another governmental entity, or for the sales of surplus, or desires to increase and/or extend an existing agreement, all as explained by the attached Exhibit "A," which by this reference is incorporated herein, and

WHEREAS in response thereto, bids/proposals (or prices from another governmental agreement) were received, all as evidenced by Exhibit "A," and

WHEREAS the Board of Contracts and Awards and/or the requesting division have heretofore made their recommendations, which may include waiver of the formal competitive bid process because it was not practicable to follow said process, or because the purchase is from a single source, or there is an emergency that requires such waiver, and/or waiver of minor deviations, and in the case of sale of surplus, a declaration of surplus has been made certifying that said items are no longer essential for continued effective utility service, as explained in Exhibit "A," and





WHEREAS the Director requests authorization, pursuant to TMC 1.06.269 A, to amend contract amounts up to \$500,000 and to approve term extensions and renewals for all items contained in Exhibit "A;" Now,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the Public Utility Board of the City of Tacoma hereby concurs and approves the recommendations of the Board of Contracts and Awards and/or the requesting division, and approves, as appropriate: (1) the purchase and/or furnishing of those materials, supplies, equipment or services recommended for acceptance; (2) the sale of surplus materials, supplies or equipment recommended for acceptance; (3) the Interlocal agreement that authorizes purchase off another governmental entity's contract; (4) the increase and/or extension of an existing agreement, and said matters may include waiver of the formal competitive bid process and/or waiver of minor deviations, all as set forth on Exhibit "A," and authorizes the execution, delivery and implementation of appropriate notices, contracts and documents by the proper officers of the City for said transactions, and (5) the administrative authority of the Director, per TMC 1.06.269 A., to amend contract amounts up to \$500,000 and to approve term extensions and contract renewals for all items in Exhibit "A."

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

Tacoma Power requests approval to increase Contract No. 4600013096, to Potelco, Inc., Sumner, WA, by \$1,900,000, and Contract No. 4600013098, to Wilson Construction Company, Canby, OR, by \$300,000, plus any applicable taxes, for Transmission and Distribution Augmented Crew Services. This increase will bring the Augmented Crew Services contracts to a cumulative total of \$6,520,547.50, plus any applicable taxes. Potelco, Inc., \$5,320,547; Wilson Construction Company, \$900,000; and Michels Corporation, \$300,000 (no increase).

BACKGROUND:

These contracts are utilized to augment Tacoma Power's work force by furmishing skilled line and wire electrician crews and equipment. Multiple contracts were awarded to help meet requirements for specialized equipment and/or work forces on short notice. Additionally, during prolonged outage scenarios it is favorable to have an established working agreement with multiple companies. Work is assigned as-needed based upon the contractor's availability, performance, unit pricing and the type of task to be completed.

ISSUE: The requested funds will be used during the remainder of the contract term, through February 17, 2021, when it is anticipated we will continue to see heavier than usual usage due to customer driven new service work, previous delays in capital work as a result of operational changes caused by the impacts of COVID-19, and based on a number of upcoming projects, which include support for some of the following types of work:

- Overhead conductor upgrades and restrings
- Underground cable replacement
- Pole replacements
- Emergency restoration
- Preparation of poles for telecommunication attachments (make-ready)

ALTERNATIVES: Tacoma Power could issue a new Request for Bids for augmented crew services. However, this would not be advisable as it would create a lapse in service during the critical storm season, potentially impacting system reliability and service to Tacoma Power's customers. Issuing a new RFB would likely result in higher costs.

COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:

Request for Bids Specification No. PT17-0347F was opened December 12, 2017. Six companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Five submittals were received



and contracts were awarded to the three responsive low bidders, Potelco, Inc., Michels Corporation, and Wilson Construction Company.

CONTRACT HISTORY: Contracts were originally awarded to Potelco, Inc., Michels Corporation, and Wilson Construction Company as a result of Request for Bids Specification No. PT17-0347F in February 2018. Utility Board Resolution No. U-10991, dated February 14, 2018, approved a cumulative total of \$2,620,547.50, with initial contract values of \$400,000 to Potelco, Inc., \$300,000 to Michels Corporation, and \$300,000 to Wilson Construction Company, for a two-year contract term with a one-year renewal option.

In October 2019, amendments were issued to increase the Potelco, Inc. contract by \$1,200,000, bringing the total to \$3,220,547, and to increase the Wilson Construction Company contract by \$300,000, bringing the total to \$600,000, and the cumulative total for the three contracts to \$4,120,547.50 as approved by Utility Board Resolution No. U-11103.

In August 2020, the Potelco, Inc. contract was administratively increased by \$200,000, bringing the total to \$3,420,547, and the cumulative total for the three contracts to \$4,320,547.50.



RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:

Tacoma Rail recommends a contract be awarded to Coast Rail Inc., Burley, WA, for upgrades of approximately 1,425 feet of railroad track and other associated work, in the amount of \$930,360.00, plus applicable taxes.

BACKGROUND:

ISSUE: Periodic replacement of heavily used segments of railroad track are required to enhance safety and mitigate potential service interruptions resulting from deteriorated track conditions. This project will include the removal of heavily worn 105-year old 90-pound rail and replacement with new 115-pound rail, select crosstie replacement, installation of two new crossovers, restoration of three driveway crossings and other associated track materials.

ALTERNATIVES: There are no practical alternatives. This project is consistent with ongoing incremental infrastructure improvements meant to reduce frequent track maintenance outages necessary to prolong usability lifecycles. The planned project will significantly improve the track structure and improve safety.

COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:

Request for Bid Specification No. TR20-0218F was opened September 8, 2020. Five companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Three submittals were received.

Coast Rail Inc., submitted a bid that resulted in the lowest evaluated submittal after consideration of EIC participation goals. The table below reflects the amount of the base award.






