

RESOLUTION NO. U-11262

A RESOLUTION authorizing Tacoma Rail to accept funding awarded by the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to install new grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple locations.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Beltline
Division (d.b.a. "Tacoma Rail"), requests approval to accept funding awarded by
the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to install new
grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple locations, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Rail submitted two applications for financial assistance to install active signalization equipment at three passive highway-railroad crossings, and WSDOT Local Programs Division has notified Tacoma Rail that \$1,315,000, was awarded with the requirement that Tacoma Rail contribute \$185,000, towards the completion of the projects, and

WHEREAS the project locations are identified as Lincoln Avenue,
USDOT No. 932-777T, and two grade crossings on Port of Tacoma Road, near
Lincoln Avenue, numbered USDOT 852-637U and USDOT 852-638B, and

WHEREAS grant funding for Lincoln Avenue is \$745,000, with a matching funds requirement of \$105,000, and the grant funding for the two crossings on Port of Tacoma Road is \$570,000, with a matching funds requirement of \$80,000, and

WHEREAS the projects are intended to enhance safety by installing grade crossing signal system(s) to include flashing LED lights to alert motorists when railroad equipment is occupying the highway-railroad grade crossing, and



WHEREAS matching funds are budgeted in Tacoma Rails 2021/22
Capital Outlay Budget, and should completion of the project(s) extend beyond
2022, a new budget assumption will be proposed in the following biennium
cycle, and

WHEREAS it is in the best public interest to accept grant funding; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the grant funding from the Washington State Department of Transportation, that provides for the acceptance of funds in the amount of \$1,315,000, and requires Tacoma Rail's contribution in matching funds in the amount of \$185,000, to install new grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple locations in Tacoma, is accepted and hereby approved, the City Council is requested to approve and authorize grant funding, and the proper officers are authorized to execute said grant funding acceptance substantially in a form as on file with the Clerk and as approved by the City Attorney.

SUMMARY: Tacoma Rail requests authorization to accept grant funding awarded by the Washington State Department of Transportation to install new grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple locations.

BACKGROUND: Subsequent to submitting two applications for financial assistance to install active signalization equipment at three (3) passive highway-railroad grade crossings, WSDOT Local Programs Division notified Tacoma Rail that a total of \$1,315,000.00 was awarded, and requires Tacoma Rail to contribute \$185,000.00 toward completion of the projects. Letters of support for the project locations were provided by the Tacoma Public Works Department and the Port of Tacoma.

The project locations are identified as Lincoln Avenue, USDOT No. 932-777T, and two grade crossings on Port of Tacoma Road, near Lincoln Avenue, numbered USDOT 852-637U and USDOT 852-638B. Grant funding for Lincoln Avenue is \$745,000 with a matching funds requirement of \$105,000. Grant funding for the two crossings on Port of Tacoma Road is \$570,000 with a matching funds requirement of \$80,000.

WSDOT Local Programs staff has advised Tacoma Rail that consistent with their internal protocols, the two notification letters dated May 4, 2021, constitute the entirety of the funding agreement with the Agency.

The projects to install grade crossing signal system(s) to include flashing LED lights to alert motorists when railroad equipment is occupying the highway-railroad grade crossing, is intended to enhance safety.

SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

Subsequent to the Tacoma Public Utility Board's approval, Tacoma Rail now requests City Council authorization to accept grant funding awarded by the Washington State Department of Transportation to install new grade crossing signalization equipment at multiple locations.

BACKGROUND:

This Department's Recommendation is Based On: TPU-Rail's Submittal of two applications for financial assistance to install active signalization equipment at three (3) passive highway-railroad grade crossings, WSDOT Local Programs Division notified Tacoma Rail that a total of \$1,315,000.00 was awarded, and requires Tacoma Rail to contribute \$185,000.00 toward completion of the projects. Letters of support for the project locations were provided by the Tacoma Public Works Department and the Port of Tacoma.

The project locations are identified as Lincoln Avenue, USDOT No. 932-777T, and two grade crossings on Port of Tacoma Road, near Lincoln Avenue, numbered USDOT 852-637U and USDOT 852-638B. Grant funding for Lincoln Avenue is \$745,000 with a matching funds requirement of \$105,000. Grant funding for the two crossings on Port of Tacoma Road is \$570,000 with a matching funds requirement of \$80,000.



Project Title: Lincoln Ave Signalization Installation

Install active grade-crossing signalization equipment on Lincoln Avenue, between Port of Tacoma Road and Thorne Road. The proposed project would add two cantilevered LED flashing light structures with shoulder mounted flashing LED lights, belis and gates to the crossing.

Project Title: Port of Tacoma Road Signalization installation

Install active grade-crossing signalization equipment on the Port of Tacoma Road near Lincoln Avenue. The proposed project would add two cantilevered LED flashing light structures with shoulder mounted flashing LED lights and bells to the crossing, Both crossings will inter-tie into the existing traffic light at the intersection of Lincoln Ave and Port Road unless not feasible.
