

# **RESOLUTION NO. U-11344**

A RESOLUTION related to revenue collection, approving the write-off of uncollectible debt, for a total amount of \$30,595.88, pursuant to Tacoma Municipal Code (TMC) 1.06.226.

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Light
Division (d/b/a "Tacoma Power") works diligently to collect revenue owed,
including communicating with vendors and other entities who might owe money
to the City, payment plan options, discussion with the City Attorney's office to
file a claim in court, capturing amounts from performance bonds, and/or
referring to the City's collection agency, and

WHEREAS occasionally, after such efforts are made, it is determined that some amounts are uncollectable and need to be written off; if the City fails to write-off the uncollectable debts, then the City's financial statements lose accuracy as it reflects the City is owed more revenue than it anticipates collecting, and

WHEREAS an amount of \$72,742.48, was invoiced to CDK Construction Services, Inc. by Tacoma Power for damage to utility property occurring on January 28, 2019, and

WHEREAS the amount of \$42,146.60 has been received from CDK
Construction Services, Inc. and, following the recommendation of the City
Attorney and Director of Utilities, it has been determined to be in the best
interest of Tacoma Power to accept the amount received as settlement of the
above invoice, and



WHEREAS in alignment with the City's Write-Off Policy 2.05, amounts may be determined as uncollectable and written off when a final charge has been generated and all reasonable collection efforts have taken place, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Power has exhausted all reasonable collection efforts against CDK Constructions Services, Inc. and the remaining balance of \$30,595.88 is requested to be authorized to be written-off as uncollectable, and

WHEREAS pursuant to TMC 1.06.226, write-offs over \$25,000, require Public Utility Board approval; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City of Tacoma are hereby authorized to write-off uncollectable debt in a total amount of \$30,595.88, pursuant to TMC 1.06.226.

**SUMMARY**: Tacoma Power is seeking Public Utility Board approval to write-off an amount that exceeds \$25,000. Pursuant to TMC 1.06.226, write-offs over \$25,000 require Public Utility Board approval. An original amount of \$72,742.48 was invoiced to CDK Construction Services, Inc. for property damages occurring on January 28, 2019. In recommendation of the City Attorney and approval of the Director of Utilities, acceptance of a settlement offer of \$42,146.60 has been determined to be in the best interest of Tacoma Power. The remaining balance of \$30,595.88 is requested to be authorized to be written-off. In alignment with the City's Write-Off Policy 2.05, account amounts may be determined as uncollectable and written off when a final charge has been generated and all reasonable collection efforts have taken place.

**BACKGROUND**: The City works hard to collect revenue it is owed. These efforts include communications with vendors, payment plan options, discussion with the legal department to file a claim in court, capturing amounts from performance bonds, and/or referral to the City's collection agency. Occasionally, after such efforts are made, it is determined that an amount is uncollectable and needs to be written off. If the City fails to write-off the uncollectable debts, then the City's financial statements lose accuracy since it appears the City is owed more revenue than it actually anticipates collecting. By leaving the uncollectable amount on the City's financial statements are overstated by \$30,595.88. It is a best practice to write-off uncollectable debt.
