What is a variance?

A variance is an allowable deviation from specific requirements of a National Electrical Code (NEC), Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 296-46B, or City of Tacoma Electrical Code section where a proposed alternate method of installation will provide equal or higher safety objectives.

What won't a variance do?

A variance will not avoid compliance with the intention of a code section or rule. A variance is not a way to recover from an installation or design error. A variance will not be granted if the alternate method would reduce the safety of the installation or equipment.

What does a variance cover?

If the variance is granted, it shall be limited to the particular site and installation covered in the application and will NOT be considered as a precedent for other installations.

Who may apply for a variance?

Only the property owner or electrical contractor, those responsible for compliance with RCW 19.28, may apply for a variance.

Who grants a variance?

A variance is granted only by the City of Tacoma Chief Electrical Inspector upon written request, as outlined in Section 12.06A.155 of the Tacoma Municipal Code.
