

How to recycle your holiday tree:

- To recycle your tree curbside, remove the tree stand, tinsel, decorations and any nails or staples. Place the tree in your yard waste container for pick up on your regularly scheduled collection day. The tree must fit into the closed container (you may have to cut the tree into pieces).
- If you do not have curbside service or prefer not to cut your tree, please bring it to the Tacoma Transfer and Recovery Center for free disposal.

All trees collected become Cascade Compost, a beneficial soil amendment that is popular with home and commercial gardeners. Treecycling helps save valuable landfill space, while the compost created enhances soil quality, saves water and reduces reliance on chemical fertilizers.

What is wastewater treatment?

The water that leaves your home through sinks, showers and toilets flows through sewer pipes to a wastewater treatment plant where it is treated before being released into Commencement Bay.

The biosolids also undergo a rigorous treatment process and are later transformed into TAGRO, a variety of premium soil amendment products that can transform your lawn and garden.
